Last Sunday of the Month: because we are limited to having just 65 people in church, for now we will not be having the 10 a.m. bilingual Mass the last Sunday of the month.

Adoration: We have resumed Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on a limited basis on the first Friday of the month, in a new format. All are welcome between 1-3 p.m. the first Friday of the month, but please wear a mask and sit (or kneel) socially distanced.

We are keeping the same Covid-19 procedures as in previous weeks: our capacity is 65 in the church and 25 in the hall: Mass is broadcast on our website. sscolumbabrigid.org. If you come to Mass you need to register and wear a mask. Someone will take your temperature and instruct you where to sit. Communion will be distributed only in the hand. If the church is at capacity you may sit in the church hall, and if it's full too, in your car or the Sister Karen Garden until Communion. Thank you for your cooperation. God bless you!

The youth asked to be more involved at Mass every week, not just the Youth Mass. So starting soon, one youth lector will be assigned along with an adult lector for many of our Masses.
