We hope you've adapted to our new way of celebrating Mass. At this stage we have a capacity of 65 in the church and 25 in the hall. If you don't feel well or are not comfortable being around so many people, we encourage you to stay home. With Livestream down, check our parish Facebook and web pages for how to view Mass online. If you come to Mass you need to register and wear a mask, and someone will take your temperature and instruct you where to sit. Communion will be distributed only in the hand. We have new hand sanitizing dispensers, but we encourage you to bring your own sanitizer and use it after touching any surfaces. We will not be holding hands during the Our Father or hugging during the Sign of Peace. If the church and hall are at capacity you may sit in your car or in the Sister Karen Garden until Communion. Due to the COVID-19 guidelines from New York State limiting the seating capacity in St. Mary's Cathedral, we invite you to join us via livestream at www.rcdony.org/ordination on Saturday, August 1, 2020 at 11:00am. The Ordination Mass program will be available at www.rcdony.org/program shortly before the Ordination.

Rosary: Every week someone new seems to join us for our bilingual House Rosaries on Zoom at 7 p.m. on Mondays. (If you don't know how to pray the Rosary, log in at 6:55 and we will teach you!) You can find the link on our website or Facebook. Or, contact Carmen or Pedro Rivera, Deacon Jerry, or Fr. Jud who could all help you log on. We pray the first part of each Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be in English, and the second part in Spanish. Most of the other prayers are said in English.

Thank You: We received \$1,831.25 in last week's collection and \$50 for HOPE/ Outreach, as well as \$100 in other donations. As we outlined in last year's parish financial statements, we need about \$6,000 per week (in the collection, hall rentals, fundraisers, etc.) to balance our budget, or roughly double what we are bringing in now. Bishop Ed said earlier this year that every parish will need to balance its budget, so we have our work cut out for us. We understand if you are not able to give at this time due to financial hardship. Care for Creation

Youth Group Corner: Our Youth continue to stay connected through Zoom. We are very proud of them all. Last week we were told that Thank You letters will be going to all the area hospitals to the healthcare workers. As we all know a simple Thank You means so much. We were also informed that they are planning to have a picnic/team building activity sometime in August, all this with utmost importance of safety. Thank you to our Youth Group. Ride for Roswell: although the Ride for Roswell to raise funds for cancer research has been modified due to Covid-19, Fr. Jud will still be riding about 44 miles on Grand Island on August 8 with a smaller number of socially distanced riders. He'll also walk his bike over the South Grand Island bridge, despite his fear of heights and tall bridges, as a sign of solidarity with all those who fear an upcoming cancer treatment. Family Promise Renovated! You may have noticed a lot of commotion around the Sister Karen building lately. Well, construction is finally wrapping up on a major model shift for Family Promise of WNY. Remember before how homeless families had to sleep overnight at different churches across Erie County? Well, it turns out this rotational model was not lining up with best practices of trauma-informed care. Family Promise wanted to do the best we possibly could for our families, which included the stability of housing them in one place during the trauma of homelessness. In 2019, we completed an over \$200,000 capital campaign which we have spent making critical renovations to the former parish school to rezone it from school to residential. Changes include creating 6 family units, multiple bathrooms and showers, a sprinkler system and all new furniture. We are showcasing our building in July before we reopen intakes for families in August. If you have a second and want to stop by, we'll happily give you a tour (with masks)! — Peace, Lu Firestone
