Adoration: Until further notice, we will not be having Adoration on First Fridays. If a group of at least four parishioners is willing to organize a group that can be responsible for setting up and attending Adoration, we would be happy to resume monthly Adoration. Please contact Fr. Jud or Paula if you are interested.

The diocese has encouraged us to follow all local, state and federal guidance on COVID-19. The dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass has been lifted, and all practicing Catholics are invited to resume regular, in-person worship. You are no longer required to register in advance to attend Mass. We recommend that if there is room, attendees continue to sit in every other pew. Masks are optional, but out of pastoral concern the safety of others should always be considered. The diocese has not relaxed the guidelines regarding full choirs, but we hope that by the fall choirs may be allowed to return in full. We are no longer streaming the 4:00 Mass on our website, but will continue to stream the 9:00 and 11:00 Masses. We hope to have the 10:00 bilingual Mass and social on August 29. Thanks for going with the flow as restrictions continue to change!

Latest News on the Road to Renewal: From the Office of Renewal: It seems to make sense to slow things down a bit. After consultation with Bishop Mike, the Office of Renewal and Development is adding in more development time to ensure a clearer state of "readiness and adoption" for the Families model to move forward. Specifically, this means:

- 1. The Renewal office will use the summer months to bring clarity to many of the questions that have been raised in the consultations that have taken place and a Gardenin' Angel! The next gardening day to communicate them.
- 2. The Vicars are being asked to postpone meetings meant for consultation and review of the Families of Parishes until further notice when more clear information and direction can be taken.
- 3. Pilot parishes that were to be identified and announced will be moved to a later date so that more preparatory groundwork can be ready for their announcement and launch.
- 4. A clear communication plan will be put into place to help parishes, laity, and clergy to gain a better understanding of the Renewal and Families of Parish-
- 5. With regard to proposed families. NO meetings should be had at this point between parishes within a potential family. This is preemptive and could undermine the entire process.

The Renewal encompasses so much more than Families of Parishes. Adjusting our pace will allow us to begin the Spiritual Renewal that is needed in our Diocese and Parishes.
